Board Meeting

Call to order conducted by Angela Trillhaase at 7:04 p.m.

President's report

Angela Trillhaase presented.

Activities since the April 19 board meeting:

- Reviewed and provided feedback for Beach SOP.
 Thanks to ALL who gave their input.
- Looking to involve Sheryl Devore in her specialty area. She has expressed interest, but we have had some difficulty locating her. Anyone on the board know her and can assist? Sheryl DeVore has worked as a full-time and freelance reporter, editor, and photographer for the Chicago Tribune and its subsidiaries. She's the author of several books on nature and the environment.
- Reviewed beach picnics in light of Phase 4.
 Keeping our eyes on this quickly changing situation.
- Registered for webinar on phosphorus reduction.
 Still need to listen to the replay. All board members are encouraged to educate themselves on this topic.
- Participated in numerous conversations on lifeguards. Congratulations to Mary Ellen and Ginny, looks like we're off to a solid start.
- Working with Village of Mundelein to keep consistent communication stream between them and the Board on the Banbury Road Construction Project. Village has been very responsive and communicative.

 Regarding the train bridge, we need to check with insurance about any shared responsibility.

Secretary's Report

Megan Boedecker presented.

The board was not given ample time to review the April meeting minutes. Megan proposed we table the motion until the June meeting, at which the board will approve both the April and May minutes.

Motion made by Megan Boedecker to table the approval vote until June. Angela Trillhaase seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

Mac Goodwin presented.

Income

Annual homeowner assessments are at 88% realized through April. Still trying to tease out how much of that is current vs. past dues.

Other operating income continues to be boat stickers and boat storage.

Expenses

Expenses for the year are 40% lower than budget and consistently running lower than projections. Beach expenses began to realize with landscaping (\$1,600) and lake maintenance (\$17,000) contracts renewed during April. April marks the month to accrue LLPOA reserve contributions for the 2021 budget year.

Positive actions

- LLPOA administration waived 2020 residential late fees for homeowners who paid through mid-April 2020
- No new actions to report on Bad Debt / Reserves study.

On the Horizon

Action needs to be made in accordance with Audit findings and diversify reserves in accordance with FDIC insurance.

Lifeguards

We have a great group of lifeguards and gate guards this year! The first guard staff meeting of the season was held yesterday. Luke reviewed the beach procedure manual with the staff since all of our lifeguards and gate guards are new this year. As a reminder, South Beach opens with lifeguards Saturday, May 29. The official beach hours will be Monday through Friday noon to 6 p.m., and Saturday and Sunday 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. Please remember to bring your beach tags with you and sign in with the gate guard. Flags will be flown for swimming conditions, either green, yellow or red. More information about the flags and beach rules can be found on our website at locklomondlake.com under the Our Lake tab.

Banbury Park tree

The tree has been removed from the fence and the fence has been repaired.

Lake management report

Steve Shiley presented.

In lieu of the weed harvesting this year, McCloud Aquatics applied Sonar Gensis and Diquat on Wednesday, May 12. From Brian at McCloud Aquatics: "Today I treated the Lake With a contact herbicide as well as a systemic herbicide. I spot treated for curly leaf that was spread somewhat sporadically around the Lake. I spent extra time near docks and heavy growth areas.

The fluridone product will stay in the water for a few weeks to provide a low dose concentration of product. The contact herbicide should have very quick results. We will be back tomorrow for normal service and a day next week to check on curly leaf progress."

It's dying off, but he is going to do another round of Diquat this week. He said the weeds are browning up and should be gone by Memorial Day weekend. He was back today to spot treat. Let Steve Shiley know if you see hotspots flare up throughout the season. McCloud will come back out at no cost.

Question: What about the die-off that is falling to the bottom of the lake?

There is much less than last year, so the harvesting wasn't necessary this year. The little bit that will fall to the bottom of the lake won't make a huge impact. We are likely going to do a sonar treatment in fall or super early spring to impact winter growth.

Boat report

Luke Emde presented.

It has been nice to see the amount of boats being used on the lake this early in the season. Seems like a lot of residents are taking advantage of the dry spring by enjoying themselves on the lake. If you have not received a boat sticker, storage sticker, or electric powered sticker please reach out to Luke Emde at lukeemde@lochlomondlake.com.

Boat storage at North beach is currently full at the moment so no request to store a boat will be honored for North beach at this time. We anticipate a couple spots opening this month with some non-compliant boats being removed. South Beach has plenty of storage room available for residents looking to store a kayak, row boat, or canoe. However, both beaches are at their limit for paddle boat storage at this time.

Important reminders

- Any and all boats entering Loch Lomond MUST be registered with the association and display current up to date boating stickers. This includes lake front property owners.
- All electric powered watercraft require an application, permit, and additional sticker prior to entering the lake. No exceptions!
- Any boats stored at North or South Beach require a yearly storage sticker along with a yearly boat sticker. Any boat that does not have an up to date LLPOA sticker is subject to removal.

North beach report

Megan Boedecker presented on behalf of Mickey Emde.

The beach and park are looking pretty good considering we have had very little rain. That is the benefit of planting native plants that have deep roots and can survive our extremes in weather. We are working to leave some of the shoreline at the beach open for dogs and boats but reduce the impact of sediment runoff and erosion by creating a shoreline buffer. This ongoing project was compromised last summer with lake spraying but we are hoping some of the lily pads will come back along with the native shoreline plants. Several boats right along the fence may need to be moved to a more appropriate storage spot, since that area will be a do not mow or treat section. Just a reminder your boat needs to be locked and stored upside down. Looking forward to creating even more gardens in the future.

South beach report

Megan Boedecker presented on behalf of Ginny Rounds.

South beach cleanup went great. Mary Ellen can report with any outstanding tasks. We will continue to work on tasks until resolved. Thank you to everyone who helped.

The village has turned the water back on at South Beach. A cracked valve was discovered and that has been replaced. The shower drain was backing up. The plumber has cleaned out the drain. Just a reminder for residents to be sure to try and keep the drain clean of debris and sand.
