Native Trees for the Future

- Loch Lomond is an Oak & Hickory forest, with many trees over 100 or 200 years old!
 We are fortunate!
- Many residents have planted the next generations of trees over the past 70 years, but there are still more older trees than younger ones.
- We are 1-2 tree generations behind planting the trees for the future! We need to plant for the next generations of trees now!
- If you find a volunteer tree (pops up naturally and unexpectedly)
 you may need to take care to support it, place a wire cage around it
 to protect it from animals and accidental mowing. Within a few
 years you may develop the next generation of trees!

Swamp White Oak - Quercus bicolor Bur Oak - Quercus macrocarpa

Northern Red Oak - Quercus rubra

American Basswood - Tilia americana

Red Maple - Acer rubrum

Blue Beech or Musclewood - Carpinus caroliniana

Eastern Redbud - Cercis canadensis

Kentucky Coffeetree - Gymnocladus dioicus

Bald Cypress - Taxodium distichum

Hickory - Carya spp

Shagbark Hickory - Carya ovata

Eastern White Pine - Pinus strobus

Northern White-Cedar - Thuja occidentalis

Eastern Redcedar - Juniperus virginiana
