

Fishing Regulations for Loch Lomond

The following rules are for Loch Lomond members and their guests. The Association stocks the lake with game fish. Please help everyone enjoy better fishing by observing the following rules:

Bass - The creel limit is six (6) per day per person with no minimum length requirements. We highly recommend that bass longer than 15” be released for reproduction purposes.

Northern Pike - The creel limit is three (3) per day per person with a minimum length requirement of 24” We highly recommend that all Northern Pike be released.

Bluegill & Crappie - No creel or size limit

Catfish - No creel or size limit

No fishing from the earthen dam or spillway at anytime

No cleaning of fish is allowed in the beach areas.

No winter structures may be left overnight on the lake ice

No motorized vehicles, gas powered boats, ATV's, snowmobiles, etc are allowed on the lake or on the ice.

All fishermen, including ice fishermen, must be current paid-up members or paid-up member's guests. Membership identification should be carried at all times when fishing. Members must accompany guests AT ALL TIMES.

All fishermen 16 years and older must have a valid State of Illinois fishing license.

All boats must have a valid State of Illinois registration sticker and an LLPOA sticker. No guest's boats are allowed.

An IL-DNR officer frequently patrols Loch Lomond to insure compliance with their regulations i.e life jackets, equipment, licenses, registration etc.(Revised 8/26/18)
