Dear Loch Lomond Homeowners,

The Association is now accepting payment of assessments from residents for the 2024 year. Residents who wish to contribute toward the maintenance and upkeep of the Lake and Beaches may submit payment either electronically, or via check using the return envelope enclosed. Please note that, at this time, payment of assessments is not required.
